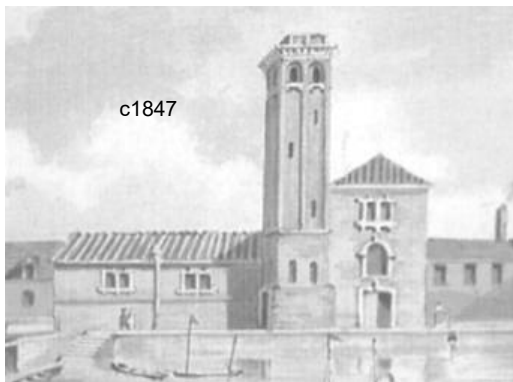

Starcross Fishing & Cruising Club

When Starcross Yacht Club, (founded c.1827), moved up river to Powderham in 1959, a small group of members remained at Starcross as they deemed it to be more convenient. On 14th October 1959 the inaugural meeting of SFCC took place, and Brian Claridge was elected Commodore. In the early days meetings were held in the Courtenay Arms. The club soon acquired a lease from British Rail for Ashes Quay which had been vacated by SYC. The club flourished and by May the following year had over 160 members.

In 1973 the Club purchased Regent House. It was transformed by volunteers into a Club House which was opened by Sir Alec Rose on 6th April 1973.

The club continued to grow and in 1993 had the opportunity to purchase the Brunel Tower. It had been built by I. K. Brunel in 1847 as an Atmospheric Railway Pumping Station, and then subsequently been a Coal Store, Methodist Chapel, and a Railway Museum.

Club volunteers converted the ground floor of the building for dinghy storage and this was opened on 30th April 1994 by Clive Bastone. Three years later, and after months of dedicated work by members volunteering their skills, the new club house was completed and our President at the time, Gordon Mortimer, officially opened the Brunel Tower building on 7th February 1997.

The club boasts a function room which incorporates a full length skittle alley, and can seat over 100 people for meals. Also a lounge and bar area with spectacular views over the Exe Estuary, together with waterside facilities that include showers, dinghy and engine storage areas, pontoon moorings, drying grids with both power and water, fish room and ample car parking.

Meals: Service is available in the club house on Saturday evenings from 19.00 - 20.45 hrs, except when occasional special functions are held. Details of these will be advertised on the Club Notice Boards and Website.

Car Parks: Parking is strictly for fully paid up members whilst using the clubs facilities, and on a first come first served basis. ***We provide parking for cars and small vans only.*** Motorhomes and larger vehicles over 5.5m long may only use our car parks with the express permission of the General Committee. The car parks are monitored by ANPR Cameras and members ***MUST*** ensure that they have emailed their Vehicle Registration Number, Name and Membership Number to: ***parking@starcross-fcc.co.uk*** **prior to parking**, so it may be added to the 'White List'. Otherwise you will incur a charge. ***The Brunel Tower car park is for short stay use only.*** Cars left overnight, or when members are away cruising, ***SHOULD*** be parked in Regent House car park. Members may only park one vehicle at a time on club property. Any member abusing these rules may have their registration number removed from the 'White List' and incur a charge. Residential parking of vehicles is not permitted in Brunel Tower or Regents House car parks at any time.

House Keeping: The club does not have the facility to store personal items. At no time should fuel cans or flares be stored

on club property. Due to our club waste now needing to be screened, there is no longer a facility to accommodate any personal waste at all. So please take it home with you, or to a public amenity. Pet owners are expected to 'clean up' after them. Please ensure that the car parks and slipways are not left fouled.

Dinghy & Engine Racks: These are allocated by the Membership Secretary, Tom McFarlane, who will issue labels.

All dinghies and engines ***MUST*** display their rack allocation labels, or they will be removed without notice. And if not claimed within 21 days may then be disposed of.

Brunel Landing Pontoon Finger Berths: Please discuss availability, and cost, with the Membership Secretary.

Ashes Quay Scrubbing Grid: Grid Reservations can be made in the diary kept on the bar. Members are entitled to use the grid free of charge for 3 days per year. Any additional usage will be charged at an agreed rate.

Ashes Quay Moorings: Trot Moorings are available for boats up to 23 ft LOA. An annual fee is payable on 1st January each year. Please check availability with the Membership Secretary.

Visitors: Visitors are Always Welcome - Members ***MUST*** enter the names of their guests in the Visitors Book and countersign with their own signature. No more than three guests may be introduced on any one day and the same guest may not be introduced more than six times in any calendar year.

Prospective members will be expected to have an active interest in water based activities and will be asked to attend a club familiarisation evening. We unfortunately cannot offer social-only memberships.

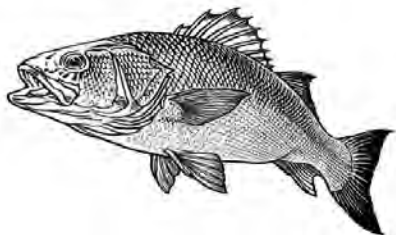
Club Trophies - Trophies will be awarded to competition winners and also nominated specimen fish, or bags, correctly recorded, and witnessed, between 1st December and 30th November.

Fish of the Month - The monthly winner, throughout the year, will be the best recorded fish, caught within 25 nt ml of the Exe Clear Water Buoy, and which has been properly weighed and witnessed. Each winner will receive an award.

Latest competition information should get 'Posted' on the Club Board, Facebook, and the Website on the Friday before an event.

Members are also asked to use their common sense if the weather looks unsuitable.

SFCC Fishing Competition Accumulator



The Competition Accumulator award goes to the angler scoring most position points over a series of 7 specially selected competitions.

These being; Pollack, Flounder, Gilt-Head Bream, Plaice, Black Bream, Mackerel, and Bass.

1st place secures 10 points, 2nd 9 points, 3rd 8 points, etc. all the way down to a possible 1 point for 10th place.

A competitor's best 4 results only, will count out of the series of 7 competitions.

In the event of tied points the single best specimen weighed-in, throughout the competitions, will decide the individual's position.

**The winner will be our
Competition Accumulator Champion.**

GENERAL RULES APPLICABLE TO FISHING

1. SFCC boat fisherman's trophy season will open on 1st December each year, and close on 30th November, and 'Fish of the Month' awards will continue through the winter.

2. All fish eligible for SFCC trophies shall be caught by members only. Hand line, or rod and line may be used. For competitions, a maximum of one line per competitor, with a total of three hooks (a treble or tandem hook counts as one hook), is permitted. However, Bass Competitions will be only two hooks, and Mackerel Competitions one set of 4 feathers, per line, per member, allowed.

3. Fish submitted for any trophy, or competition, must not be smaller than the minimum landing size as laid down by the Angling Trust. These are displayed in the Brunel Fish Room.

4. Members will not be eligible for club trophies whilst using their boats professionally.

5. Any fish eligible for submission for trophies must be hooked and brought alongside by the member concerned.

6. All members are urged to comply with a catch and release policy with respect of fish not taken for the table. Fish conservation is for our future sport, and for generations to come.

7. Boat Competitions, including Fish of the Month, are limited to within a 25 nt ml radius of the Exe Clear Water Buoy, unless otherwise stated.

The start and weigh-in times, for competitions, will be as displayed on the fishing notice boards.

Please see Rule 9 below for Specimen Trophy entries.

Shore Fishing is respected by the club, but no awards are currently offered.

8. All fish submitted for competition or specimen trophies are to be weighed on club scales in the Brunel Fish Room on the day of capture, and certified by one witness. The person who caught the fish cannot be the witness. Exceptions to this rule will be at the Fishing Secretaries discretion only.

9. All specimens will be judged against the Angling Trust Specimen Weights Chart for the area of capture.

10. In the event of any dispute, the decision of the Fishing Secretary will be final.

Starcross Fishing and Cruising Club Code of Conduct

SFCC members can expect:

- To feel welcome and valued.
- To be respected and treated fairly.
- To be listened to and kept informed.
- Be involved and contribute towards decisions within the club.

The club expects to maintain a high reputation in the local boating and fishing community.

To that end, club members and signed-in guests are expected to:

- Abide by the club's rules.
- Follow the club's policies and standard operating procedures (see appendix) including but not limited to health & safety, safeguarding, social media.
- Treat club property and assets with respect.
- Encourage all members to play as full a role in the club as they wish.
- Support other members in developing their skills and experience.
- Recognise the contribution of club officers, instructors and other officials, and volunteers.
- Prioritise the safety and wellbeing of participants.
- Promote courtesy to other water users.
- Treat members and visitors, and the public at large when participating in club activities, with respect and understanding, regardless of: age, capability (boating or otherwise), disability, gender identity, race, religion or belief, sex or sexual orientation.
- Avoid the use of undermining, abusive, aggressive, or discriminatory language: whether verbal or non-verbal, or other behaviour that might be regarded as disrespectful to other people and their property, including non-club members; whether on club premises, at a club event, flying or wearing club insignia, or when using the club's social media channels.

- Use established procedures where there is a genuine concern or dispute.

Misconduct should be reported to the complaints officer, (Secretary), which may lead initially to informal mediation or to formal investigation and disciplinary action.

For further information see the club's related policy and procedure document, (Rule18).

The Club is a not-for-profit organisation. All surpluses will be used to maintain, or improve, the club's facilities for the benefit of members.

The Club is affiliated to the Royal Yachting Association and the Angling Trust.

SECTION 1 - NAME AND PURPOSES

1. The name of the Club shall be **'The Starcross Fishing and Cruising Club'** (hereinafter referred to in these rules as the Club).

2. The purposes for which the Club is formed are to promote and facilitate community participation via community participation in the sports of recreational sea fishing and cruising by sail or motor. Incidentally to provide social and other facilities for members as may be from time to time determined, and in a safe environment.

SECTION 2 - OFFICERS

3. The Officers of the Club shall be Full, Family or Life Members of the Club and shall consist of;

(a) A Club President. The role of Club President shall be undertaken by a Vice President on a rotational basis in order of seniority. Any newly elected Vice Presidents will join the back of the list. The President shall be elected at the AGM, and may serve for a period of up to 3 years.

(b) There will be up to 8 Vice Presidents, who shall hold office for one year, retiring at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). All the aforementioned officers shall be eligible for re-election.

(c) Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Treasurer, and Secretary, will be elected at the AGM each year and shall hold office for one year, retiring at each AGM.

All Officers of the Club shall be eligible for re-election.

The President, or nominated deputy, shall chair all AGMs and Special General Meetings (SGMs) of the club, and has the right to attend any and all meetings held to discuss business. He or she may also address said meeting, with prior notice to the chair, but may not vote or engage in the general business of the Committee. The President's role is to ensure that the club is being managed in the best interests of the membership, and should adopt a neutral even handed approach to all matters. The role requires the President to act as our ambassador to other community groups and the wider public from time to time, as required to promote the club's best interests.

Duties of secretaries etc.

4. The Secretary, (or where specified the Membership Secretary), shall:-
 - (a) Keep a register of Club members' names and addresses (Membership Secretary).
 - (b) Conduct the correspondence of the Club.
 - (c) Keep custody of all Club documents.
 - (d) Keep full minutes of all meetings of the Club, the Committee and any sub-committee which shall be confirmed and signed by the appropriate Chairman upon the agreement of the Club, the Committee or sub-committee at the next following meeting of the Club, the Committee or sub-committee.
 - (e) Administer such insurance policy or policies as may be needed fully to protect the interests of the Club, its Officers and its members.
 - (f) Maintain contact with the Club's Legal Advisor to ensure that the Club's affairs are managed in accordance with current law.
 - (g) Maintain any such certificates or registrations, and complete any such non-financial returns, as may be required by law.

5. The Treasurer shall:-

- (a) Cause such books of account to be kept as are necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of finances of the Club.
- (b) Cause all returns as may be required by law in relation to such accounts to be rendered at the due time.
- (c) If either unwilling, or unable to act, inform the Committee who shall appoint a substitute to hold office until the next AGM.
- (d) Prepare an Annual Balance Sheet as at 31st October in each year and cause such Balance Sheet, (and accounts as necessary), to be audited at least once annually and shall thereafter cause the same to be exhibited in the Club premises at least fourteen days before the date of the Annual General Meeting.
- (e) The Treasurer, as prime user, shall ensure that two unrelated members of the Committee are always registered with access to the club's bank accounts as secondary users to cover any contingencies.

6. The Reviewers shall:-

- (a) Be appointed at the Annual General Meeting in each year and shall be two appropriately experienced members of the Club;
- (b) The Reviewers shall review the accounts and Annual Balance Sheet of the Club when called upon to do so and shall give such certificate of assurance as to the accuracy of the said accounts as shall be required by law, or by the Committee.
- (c) If either unwilling or unable to act, inform the Committee who shall appoint a substitute to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting.

SECTION 3 - MEMBERSHIP

Categories and votes of membership

- 7.** There shall be the following categories of membership with power to vote at all meetings of the Club as indicated hereunder.

A FULL MEMBER - being a person who, at the date of election, shall have attained the age of eighteen years shall have one vote.

A FAMILY MEMBER - which expression shall include one or two co-habiting adults and all children within their guardianship under eighteen years of age. Each adult partner shall have one vote.

A CADET MEMBER - being a person who, at the date of election, is under the age of eighteen shall have no vote.

Such a member shall be one who at the commencement of the subscription year joins the Club other than as a full member or a family member.

AN HONORARY MEMBER - who shall have one vote.

A LIFE MEMBER - enrolled under previous Club rules with his or her co-dwelling partner. Each adult partner shall have one vote.

A TEMPORARY MEMBER - who shall have no vote.

A DORMANT MEMBER - being a FULL, FAMILY or CADET member who has requested to become a dormant member under Rule 15, who shall have no vote.

No member may use the Club premises, or any of the facilities of the Club, until forty-eight hours have elapsed from the date of posting of notice of election.

A STAFF MEMBER - being a person who is employed by the club on a permanent basis who shall have no vote (Membership shall commence on first day of employment and end on last day of employment).

Rights and privileges of members

8. The rights and privileges of each category of membership shall be as follows:-

A FULL MEMBER shall have the full use of all the Club facilities, subject to any, and all safety guidance.

A FAMILY MEMBER, his/her co-habitee, (if any), and all the children within their guardianship under the age of eighteen shall have the full use of all the Club facilities subject only to Rule 50. And subject to any, and all safety guidance.

ge of eighteen shall have the full use of all the Club facilities subject only to Rule 50. And subject to any, and all safety guidance.

A CADET MEMBER shall have the full use of all the Club facilities subject only to Rule 50. And subject to any, and all safety guidance.

AN HONORARY MEMBER shall have the full use of all the Club facilities. And subject to any, and all safety guidance.

A DORMANT MEMBER shall have no rights or privileges whatsoever in relation to the Club or premises.

A TEMPORARY MEMBER (which expression may include members of another RYA recognised Club or organisation) shall have the full use of the Club facilities subject to any and all safety guidance, but:-

(a) Shall have no right to enter Club events unless specifically authorised by the Secretary or Committee.

(b) Shall have no right to introduce visitors to the Club or the facilities thereof.

(c) Shall have no right to take any part in the management of the Club.

(d) Is deemed to have notice of and impliedly undertakes to comply with the Club Rules and any Byelaws or Regulations as if he or she were a member of the Club and so far as the said Rules, Byelaws and Regulations may be deemed to apply to such Temporary Member.

(e) Shall be liable to be expelled from the Club premises, or to be prohibited from using the Club facilities, if in the opinion of the Secretary, he or she shall not have reasonably complied with the above conditions.

Candidates for membership shall have no privileges whatsoever in relation to the use of the Club or premises.

A staff member and his/her cohabitee, (if any), and all the children within their guardianship under the age of eighteen, shall have the full use of all the Club facilities subject only to Rule 50 and any and all safety guidance.

Membership entrance & subscription fee

9. The rate of Entrance and Subscription fees for each category of Membership shall be set by the Committee on 1st November each year, and circulated to members prior to renewal invitations being sent out. The new rate will become operative on the first day of January in the following year. The current rate of Entrance and Subscription fees shall be prominently displayed in the Club premises.

(a) Membership of the Club shall be open to anyone interested in participating in the sports of recreational sea fishing and/or cruising either powered or sail, on application regardless of sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion or other beliefs. Membership may however be limited according to available facilities on a non-discriminatory basis.

(b) Membership subscriptions will be kept at levels that will not pose a significant obstacle to people participating.

(c) The Club Committee may refuse membership or remove it, only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club or sport into disrepute. Appeal against refusal of membership may be made to the President, via Club Secretary, in writing within 60 days of notification of the decision.

10. Members shall also make the following annual payments:-

(a) Annual boat and/or engine storage fees of such sums as the Committee shall from time to time prescribe which shall entitle a member to a space in the Club's boat and/or engine storage areas.

(b) All members shall pay the Entrance fee, (if any), and their first annual subscription upon election to the Club and thereafter will be invited to renew their membership on the first day of January of the following year. Provided that a member elected after the first day of August in any year shall pay half the annual subscription applicable for that year and that a member elected after the first day of

November in any year shall not be required to pay any subscription in respect of the year of election, but shall pay, on election, the Entrance fee and the annual subscription in respect of the year following election.

Members' duty to provide an up-to-date address

11. Every member shall furnish the Membership Secretary with an up-to-date address and other information as may be required by the Committee which shall be recorded in the Register of Members and any notice sent to such address shall be deemed to have been duly delivered.

Election and retirement of members

Candidates for election

Application for membership

12. An application for membership shall be made in the form prescribed by the Committee, and shall include the name, address, and other information as required of the candidate.

(a) Applicants shall attend a meeting with the Membership Secretary and one or more of any appropriate General Committee member(s). This is to ascertain that the prospective candidate has a genuine interest in participating in recreational sea fishing or cruising.

Election of members

13. Upon receipt of an application for membership, the Membership Secretary shall enter such application in a Register of Candidates and cause the application to be displayed prominently in the Club for at least 14 days before the meeting of the Committee at which such application for membership shall be considered. The election of all classes of members is vested in the Committee and shall be a simple majority vote of those of the Committee. The Committee may refuse applications only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club into disrepute.

In considering an application the Committee shall satisfy itself that the applicant is genuinely interested in participating in recreational sea fishing or cruising. This shall be evidenced through discussion at a formally convened meeting between the Applicant, the

Membership Secretary, and one or more of any appropriate General Committee member(s).

The Membership Secretary shall inform each candidate in writing of the candidate's election or non-election, and will furnish them with a copy of the Rules and Byelaws of the Club. At the same time requesting such payments as are necessary.

Appeal against refusal to elect may be made to the membership at a General Meeting of the club.

Payment of fees upon election

14. Once an application for membership has been approved by the General Committee, the successful applicant will be notified via Membership Mojo that their application has been successful. The applicant will then have up to 30 days to pay their subscription fees. If full payment has not been received within that time, the applicant may be required to re-apply for membership.

Temporary absence of member

15. A member who, for any reason, anticipates inability to use the Club or its facilities for the whole of any one membership year shall be entitled to request **DORMANT MEMBER** status and be excused payment of the annual subscription provided that notice in writing is given to the Secretary before the last day of November in the previous year. A member wishing to be re-instated shall pay the annual subscription for the year of his re-instatement but will not be required to pay a further entrance fee.

A member can retain the status of dormant member for a maximum of 3 consecutive years after which membership will cease provided that the Committee, at its discretion and on an individual case basis, may amend this period.

Retirement of a member

16. A member desirous of retiring from membership shall give notice in writing to the Secretary before the last day of November and shall not then be liable to pay the subscription for the following year. Upon re-application by a past member the Committee may, at its discretion, waive any Entrance Fee.

A member who retires in accordance with this Rule shall not be entitled to have any part of the annual membership fee or any other fees refunded.

Arrears of subscription

17. The Committee may cancel, without notice being given, the membership of any member whose annual subscription and other annual fees are in arrears after 1st January provided that the Committee may, at its discretion, re-instate such member upon payment of arrears. No member whose annual payment is in arrears may enter any Club event or use any of the Club facilities or vote at any meeting. Members at risk of losing their membership status in this way will be warned, in writing, by the Membership Secretary.

The Committee may, at its sole discretion, commute a member's status to **DORMANT MEMBER** where particular and individual circumstances deem this justified.

Conduct of members

Under-taking by members to comply with rules

18. Every member, upon election and thereafter, is deemed to have notice of, and impliedly undertakes to comply with the Club Rules and the current Byelaws and Regulations of the Club.

Disciplinary action against members

19. Any breach of Rule 18 or any conduct which, in the opinion of the Committee, is either unworthy of a member or otherwise injurious to the interests of the Club, shall render a member liable to disciplinary action by the Committee, which may include a formal reprimand, temporary suspension of membership, immediate expulsion and/or non-renewal of membership.

Before taking such disciplinary action against any member(s), Flag Officers of the Club shall make such enquiries as they deem necessary to ensure there is a case to answer. The Committee shall call upon such a member for a written or verbal explanation of the member's conduct, and shall give the member full opportunity of making explanation to the Committee, or to resign at any stage.

A Resolution to apply any sanction shall be carried by a simple majority vote by those members of the Committee present and voting on the Resolution.

An initial appeal against any sanction, expulsion or non-renewal of membership may be made to the Club President, whom along with a number of Vice Presidents , and the Commodore, (numbering not less than 5), will hear the appeal verbally, and have the authority to call witness, and take guidance as required.

They will issue their decision to the appellant in writing within 14 days. This hearing has full powers of overturn, concur or increase of sanction imposed.

The appellant can appeal against expulsion or non-renewal of membership, directly to the membership of the Club at an AGM of all members.

Upon expulsion of a member the Committee may dispose of the former members club stored assets, if they are not removed from club premises within 30 days, in accordance of Rule 71.

Guests in the club

20. Members shall enter the names of all guests in the Visitor's Book and countersign with their own signature. Not more than three guests may be introduced in any one day and the same guest may not be introduced more than six times in any calendar year.

A member may not introduce anyone as a guest who has either been expelled from the Club or whose application for membership has been declined. The introducing member is responsible for the conduct of all those introduced against their signature.

Damage to club property

21. A member shall not knowingly remove, injure, destroy or damage any property of the Club and shall make restitution for the same if called upon to do so by the Committee, or by the Secretary upon the instructions of the Committee.

Exhibiting of notices

22. A member shall not cause any communication in whatever form to be exhibited on Club notice boards or premises without permission of the Secretary or Committee Member with responsibility for managing notice boards on the Club premises.

Settlement of accounts

23. A member shall settle any indebtedness for refreshment or otherwise before leaving the Club premises, or in accordance with any byelaw relating to the settlement of such indebtedness.

Suggestions

24. All suggestions shall be entered in the Suggestion Book and signed by the Member.

Complaints

25. Complaints of any nature relating to the management of the Club premises shall be addressed in writing to the Secretary.

Members of other RYA clubs

26. A member of any Club affiliated to the Royal Yachting Association (a list of which is published by the said Association) or Angling Trust may be authorised to use the premises of the Club by any member of the Committee of the Club. Such authorisation shall specify between which dates the said person may so use the premises.

Competitors in club competitions or events

27. Any person who is a visitor or competitor in any event sponsored by or on behalf of the Club is entitled to the use of the Club premises within a period of 24 hours before and after the specific event.

Power to expel those admitted under rules 26 & 27 hereof

28. The Secretary or any other person who has received the authority of two members of the Committee, may expel, temporarily or permanently, any person who has the right to the use of the Club premises only under Rules 26 and 27.

Limitation of club liability

29. All references to the Club in this Rule shall mean each and every individual member of the Club from time to time.

Members of the Club, their guests, and visitors, are bound by the following rule which shall also be exhibited in a prominent place within the Club premises:-

Members of the Club, their guests or visitors, may use the Club premises, and any other facilities of the Club, entirely at their own risk and impliedly accept:-

(a) The Club will not accept any liability for any damage to or loss of property belonging to members or guests.

(b) The Club will not accept any liability for personal injury arising out of the use of the Club premises, any other facilities of the Club either sustained by members or caused by the said members whether or not such damage or injury could have been attributed to or was occasioned by the neglect, default or negligence of any of them, the Officers, Committee, Trustees or Servants of the Club.

30. Membership of the Club and acceptance of these Rules by the member will be deemed to constitute consent to the holding of relevant personal data for the purposes of the Data Protection Acts.

SECTION 4 - MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Constitution of committee

31. The Management Committee (herein referred to as 'the Committee') shall consist of Flag Officers, Treasurer, Secretary, and not less than four nor more than fifteen Full or Family Members, who have attained the age of eighteen years elected at the Annual General Meeting each year to hold office until the termination of the next Annual General Meeting.

Retirement of members of the committee

32. At the Annual General Meeting each year four of the Full, Family and Life members shall retire in order of election or seniority. In the case of equal seniority the order of retirement shall, failing agreement between the members concerned, be determined by lot. Members retiring under this Rule shall be eligible for re-election to the Committee at the next Annual General Meeting.

Candidates for election to committee

33. Candidates for election to the Committee, (not being Officers of the Club), shall be those members of the retiring Committee eligible to offer themselves for re-election and such other Full, Family or Life members whose nominations, (duly proposed and seconded in writing by Full, Family or Life members of the Club), with their consent shall have been received by the Secretary at least twenty one days before the date of the Annual General Meeting in each year. Such nominations, together with the names of the Proposer and Secunder, shall be posted in the Club premises at least fourteen days prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting.

Election of committee by ballot

34. If the number of candidates for election is greater than the number of vacancies to be filled then there shall be a ballot.

No contest for election

35. If the number of candidates for election is equal to or less than the number of vacancies to be filled then all candidates shall be deemed to be elected if two thirds of those present at the Annual General Meeting, and entitled to vote, vote in favour of such election.

36. In the event of the ballot failing to determine the members of the Committee because of an equality of votes the candidate or candidates to be elected from those having an equal number of votes shall be determined by lot.

37. If, for any reason, a casual vacancy shall occur, the Committee may co-opt a Full or Family member to fill such a vacancy until the next following Annual General Meeting. In the event of the Committee failing to determine the appointment of a casual vacancy, because of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have the deciding vote.

Committee meetings

38. The Committee shall meet at least every two months making such arrangements as to the conduct, place of assembly and holding of such meetings as it may wish.

The Commodore, or in his absence the next senior Flag Officer, or a Chairman elected by those present shall preside.

39. Any member of the Committee who is absent from three meetings in the year commencing from the AGM shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee. Providing that the Secretary receives within 14 days of the third absence a full written explanation for the absences, the Committee may at its discretion allow the said member to continue to serve on the Committee.

Voting at committee

40. Voting shall be by show of hands. In the case of equality of votes the Commodore, or Chairman, (as the case may be), shall have a second and casting vote.

Quorum

41. Six members personally present shall form a quorum at a meeting of the Committee.

Powers of the Committee

Management of Club by Committee(s)

42. The Committee shall manage the affairs of the Club according to the Rules and shall cause the funds of the Club to be applied solely to the purposes of the Club or for a benevolent or charitable purpose nominated by General Meeting.

In particular the Committee shall ensure that the property and funds of the Club will not be used for the direct or indirect private benefit of members other than as reasonably allowed by the Rules and that all surplus income or profits are re-invested in the Club.

Powers to introduce new rules

43. The Committee shall make such Rules and Byelaws as it shall from time to time think fit and shall cause the same to be exhibited in the Club for 14 days before the date of implementation. Such Rules and Byelaws shall remain in force until approved or set aside by a vote at an Annual General Meeting of the Club.

Provided that no such change shall jeopardise the Club's status as a Community Amateur Sports Club, (CASC), within the meaning of the Finance Acts, or in any event alter its purposes or winding up provisions.

Appointment of sub-committees

44. The Committee may appoint such sub-committees as it may deem necessary and may delegate such of its powers as it may think fit upon such terms and conditions as shall be deemed expedient and/or required by the law. Such sub-committees shall consist of such members of the Committee or of the Club as the Committee may think fit. Officers of the Club shall be ex officio members of all such sub-committees.

Disclosure of interest to third parties

45. A member of the Committee, or a sub-committee, or any officer of the Club, in transacting business for the Club, shall disclose to third parties that he is so acting.

Limitation of committee's authority

46. The Committee, or any person or sub-committee delegated by the Committee to act as agent for the Club or its members, shall enter into contracts only as far as expressly authorised, or authorised by implication, by the members. No one shall, without the express authority of the membership in General Meeting, borrow money or incur debts on behalf of the Club or its membership.

Members' indemnification of committee

47. In pursuance of the authority vested in the Committee by members of the Club, members of the Committee are entitled to be indemnified by the members of the Club against any liabilities properly incurred by them or any one of them on behalf of the Club wherever the contract is of a duly authorised nature or could be assumed to be of a duly authorised nature and entered into on behalf of the Club.

Should the assets of the Club be insufficient to satisfy such liability, costs, expenses or payments the Committee shall be entitled to a personal indemnity from the individual members of the Club.

The limit of any individual member's indemnity in this respect shall be a sum equal to one year's subscription at the then current rate of that category of membership unless the Committee has been authorised to exceed such limit by a General Meeting of the Club.

Contractual liability

48. The Committee shall endeavour to ensure that the following clause is incorporated in every contract, lease, licence or other agreement entered into by the Committee and/or Trustees of the Club, as appropriate.

"The liability of the Committee/Trustees, for the performance of any contractual or other obligation undertaken by them on behalf of the Club, shall be limited to the assets of the Club."

Nomination of honorary members by committee

49. The Committee may nominate for election at an Annual General Meeting such Honorary Members as the Committee may think fit. The total of such Honorary Members shall not, however, at any time, exceed 4. The election of Honorary Members shall be put to the vote at the Annual General Meeting each year and such Honorary Members shall be duly elected if two thirds of those present, and entitled to vote, vote in favour of election.

Purchase and supply of excisable goods

50. The purchase for the Club of excisable goods and the supply of the same upon Club premises shall be exclusively and solely under the control of the Committee, or of a special sub-committee appointed by the Committee.

Intoxicating liquor may only be sold for consumption on the Club premises to persons over the age of eighteen who are entitled to the use of the Club premises in pursuance of the Rules, Byelaws and Regulations for the time being in force. No Cadet Member under the age of eighteen may purchase or attempt to purchase intoxicating liquor within the Club premises. The Club will not sell tobacco based products within its premises.

Hours of sale of excisable goods

51. The Committee shall cause the Club bar to be opened, (subject to terms of the Club premises certificate), at convenient times and such times shall be prominently exhibited in the Club premises for the sale of excisable goods to persons who are entitled to the use of the premises of the Club in pursuance of these Rules, (except Cadet Members as aforesaid), PROVIDED THAT visitors' names and addresses and the name of their introducer shall have been entered in the Visitor's Book upon entry to Club premises.

Profits from sale of excisable goods

52. No person shall take a commission, percentage or other such payment in connection with the purchase of excisable goods for the Club. Any profit deriving from the supply of such goods shall, (after deduction of the costs of providing such goods for the benefit of the Club), be applied to the provision of additional amenities or the purchase of property to be held in trust for the benefit of the Club.

Accounts relating to excisable goods

53. Proper accounts of all purchases and receipts shall be kept and presented at the Annual General Meeting in each year and such information as the Secretary or Auditors may require shall be furnished to enable any statutory return or statement and the payment of excise or other duty or tax to be made.

SECTION 5 - TRUSTEES

Number of & terms of reference

54. There shall be at least four Trustees of the Club who shall be appointed from time to time as necessary by the Committee of the Club from among Full, Family or Life Members who are willing to be so appointed. A Trustee shall hold office for his/her lifetime, or until he/she shall resign by notice in writing given to the Committee, or until a resolution removing him/her from office shall be passed at a meeting of the Committee by a majority comprising two-thirds of the members present and entitled to vote.

Property of club vested in trustees

55. All the property of the Club, including land and investments, shall be held by the Trustees for the time being, in their own names so far as it is necessary and practicable, on trust for the use and benefit of the Club. In the event of the death, resignation, or removal from office of a Trustee, the Committee shall nominate a new Trustee in his place, and shall as soon as possible thereafter take all lawful and practicable steps to procure the vesting of all Club property into the names of the Trustees as constituted after such nomination. For the purpose of giving effect to any such nomination, the Secretary for the time being is hereby nominated as the person to appoint new Trustees of the Club within the meaning of Section 36 of the Trustee Act 1925 and he shall by Deed duly appoint the person or persons so nominated by the Committee.

Powers of trustees

56. The Trustees shall in all respects act, in regard to any property of the Club held by them, in accordance with the directions of the Committee and shall have power to sell, lease, mortgage or pledge any Club property so held for the purpose of raising or borrowing money for the benefit of the Club in compliance with the Committee's directions, (which shall be duly recorded in the Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee), but no purchaser, lessee or mortgagee shall be concerned to enquire whether any such direction has been given.

Indemnity of trustees from club

57. In pursuance of the authority vested in the Trustees by the members of the Club the Trustees shall be indemnified by the members of the Club out of the assets of the Club from and against any liability, costs, expenses and payments whatsoever which may be properly incurred or made by them in the exercise of their duties or relation to any property of the Club vested in them, or in relation to any legal proceedings, or which otherwise relate directly or indirectly to the performance of the functions of a Trustee of the Club.

In the event that the assets of the Club be insufficient to satisfy such liability, costs, expenses or payments the Trustees shall be entitled to a personal indemnity from the individual members of the Club. The limit of any individual member's indemnity in this respect shall be a sum equal to one year's subscription at the then current rate of that category of membership unless the Trustees have been authorised to exceed such limit by a General Meeting of the Club.

SECTION 6 - MEETINGS OF THE CLUB

Annual general meeting

58. An Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held each year in the month of February on a date to be fixed by the Committee. The Secretary shall at least fourteen days before the date of such meeting post or deliver to each member notice hereof and of the business to be brought forward thereat.

Business at annual general meeting

59. No business, except the passing of the Accounts and the election of the Officers, Committee, Trustees and Auditors, and any business that the Committee may order to be inserted in the notice convening the meeting shall be discussed at such meeting unless notice thereof be given in writing by a member entitled to vote to the Secretary at least forty two days before the date of the Annual General Meeting.

Special general meeting

60. The Committee may at any time, upon giving twenty one days notice in writing, call a Special General Meeting of the Club for any special business, the nature of which shall be stated in the summons convening the meeting, and the discussion at such meeting shall be confined to the business stated in the notice sent to Members.

Special general meeting upon request of members

61. The Committee shall call a Special General Meeting upon a written request addressed to the Secretary by at least 10 Full, Family, Life or Honorary Members. The Committee shall meet within fourteen days of receiving the requisite number of requests in order to call a SGM. The Committee shall give twenty one days' notice in writing of any such Special General Meeting. The discussion at such meeting shall be confined to the business stated in the notice sent to members.

Chairman at meetings

62. At every meeting of the Club the President or the Commodore or, in his/her absence, a Chairman elected by those present shall preside.

Quorum at meetings

63. Fifteen members entitled to vote and personally present shall form a quorum at any meeting of the Club.

Entitlement to vote at meetings

64. Only Full, Family, Life and Honorary Members shall vote at any meeting of the Club. Other members may attend but are not entitled to vote.

Voting at meetings

65. Voting, except upon the election of members of the Committee, when there is one or more candidates, shall be by show of hands.

Equality of votes

66. In the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote, on any matter other than the election of members of the Committee.

Voting on rule change

67. On any resolution properly put to a meeting of the Club relating to the creation, repeal or amendment of any Rule, Byelaw or Regulation of the Club such Rule, Byelaw or Regulation shall not be created, repealed or amended except by a majority vote of at least two-thirds of those present and entitled to vote.

Provided that no such change shall jeopardise the Club's status as a Community Amateur Sports Club (CASC) within the meaning of the Finance Acts, or in any event alter its purposes or winding-up provisions.

SECTION 7 - DISSOLUTION OF THE CLUB

Dissolution of the club

68. If, upon the winding up or dissolution of the Club, there remains after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed amongst the members of the Club. The Committee shall dispose of the net assets remaining to one or more of the following:

- (a) to another Club with similar sports purposes which is a charity, and/or
- (b) to another Club with similar sports purposes which is a registered CASC, and/or
- (c) to the RYA and/or Angling Trust for use by them for related community sports.

SECTION 8 - MISCELLANEOUS

Opening of club premises

69. The Club premises shall be open to members at such times as the Committee shall direct.

70. The permitted hours for the supply of intoxicating liquor will be within the permitted licensing laws of the district.

Abandoned boats and/or dinghies and/or engines

71. If, at any time, any fees payable to the Club by any member or former member, (whether by way of arrears of subscription or facilities fees, dinghy rack fees, engine storage fees, mooring or otherwise), shall be one month or more in arrears and a boat and/or dinghy and/or engine the property of a member or former member remains upon the Club premises then the member or former member shall remove the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine from the Club immediately. If the member or former member fails to remove the boat and/or engine then the Committee may:-

(a) Move the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine to any part of the Club premises without being liable for any loss or damage to the vessel howsoever caused.

(b) Give three months' notice in writing by registered post to the member or former member at his last known address as shown in the Club Register and thereafter sell the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine and deduct any monies due to the Club from the net proceeds of sale before accounting for the balance, (if any), to the member or former member.

(c) Alternatively, if the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine is unsaleable, after giving notice in writing as aforesaid, dispose of the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine in any manner the Committee may think fit and deem the cost of so doing and any arrears as aforesaid to be a debt owing to the Club by the member or former member.

(d) The Club reserves the right to charge storage for the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine until such time as the owner collects the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine or until notice has been served under Rule (b) above.

PROVIDED ALWAYS THAT:-

Proper evidence is available to show that all reasonable steps have been taken to trace a member or former member and that, when and if the boat and/or dinghy and/or engine is sold, if the Club is unable to account to the member or former member for the balance of the proceeds of sale pursuant to Rule (b) above then the balance

of the proceeds of sale shall be placed upon bank deposit account and retained against the eventuality of a claim by the owner, (whether he be the said member or former member or otherwise), for a period of six years.

Lien

72. In addition to Rule 71 the Club shall at all times have a lien over members' or former members' boats and/or dinghies and/or engines parked on the Club's premises in respect of all monies due to the Club, whether in respect of arrears of facilities fees or subscriptions or otherwise and shall be entitled to retain possession of the boat and/or trailer until such time as all monies due to the Club have been paid in full.

Byelaws

73. The Club may adopt such Byelaws or Regulations as it considers appropriate for the good management of the Club and its facilities.

Acknowledgement

74. The Members acknowledge that these Rules constitute a legally binding contract to regulate the relationship of the members with each other and the Club.

Latest alterations to this SFCC Constitution were ratified at the AGM on Saturday 22nd February 2025.

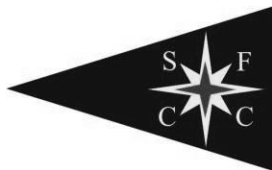
Starcross Fishing and Cruising Club has introduced a number of online payment forms to help members renew their membership and storage subscriptions.
